1 Introduction

Introduction

In line with the ethical standards and guidelines of Horizon 2020, the D10.2 describes the ethical relevant and applicable principles during the GEO4CIVHIC project, demonstrating how these issues will be considered, handled and rigorously applied.

CNR, as coordinator of the project, in order to develop this management procedure (D10.2), developed the following activities:

- 1. analysed the ethical applicable principles;*
- 2. analysed the occurrence, the level of the risk and set up preventive and corrective measures;*
- 3. decided the recording forms;*
- 4. analysed the applicable legislation for the materials, which could be imported to/exported from the EU.*

D10.2 focusses on the compliance with ethical rules and standards, relevant European legislation, international conventions and declarations, national authorizations and ethics approvals, proportionality of the research methods and the applicants' awareness of the ethical aspects and social impact of their planned research.

The objective of the procedure issued in D10.2 is also to coordinate and assist the involved partners to deal with the ethics issues raised by their research and if necessary to take preventive or/and corrective measures.

All the partners of the Consortium are involved in respecting the ethical procedure.

CNR define through D10.2 its own Ethical Policy for coordinating the partners and all the GEO4CIVHIC project's activities.

For the GEO4CIVHIC project, ethics are of high importance for the quality assurance of the project and for the project results. The GEO4CIVHIC consortium pays specific attention to ethical issues and has developed guidelines that will support the correct handling of data, as well as ensuring that national and EU laws and recommendations on privacy issues play an important role in the daily work within the consortium.

The process and guidelines will be monitored through the designed team (PIETRE Edil) and are documented in D10.2.
